1. Roll Call:

Russ Crawford, Whitney Jensen, Ralph Eyberg, Lee Staroska, Lisa Lindley, Matt Moyer, Lauren Gant, Jack Eckstaine and Jordan Allsup.

2. Approve Agenda:

At 5:16pm Staroska made the motion to approve the agenda, second by Lindley to approve the agenda. AYES: All. Motion carried.

3. Approval of Minutes:

A. June 8, 2026- Lindley made the motion, second by Jensen, to approve June 8, 2026, meeting minutes. AYES: All. Motion carried.

4. Committee Business:

A. Master Parks Plan – priority of projects, fundraising opportunities, grant writing, goals for 2026-2027 fiscal year

- Parks and Cemetery Vegetation-Pollinator Garden at Merrill Park is coming in nicely. Central Park vegetation is coming along around Vets Monument. No action necessary.
- Arbor Lake/Lake Nyanza-Allsup reported that the project is nearing 60% design and should be at that review point by the end of the month.
- Recreation Facilities Feasibility Study-Steering committee has been set up with all identified individuals agreeing to serve on the committee. City staff will look to set the first meeting in early August. No action necessary.
- Merrill Park Green Space project Allsup presented two options from different contractors converting existing ball diamond at Merrill Park into a multi-use green space as recommended by the 2025 Master Parks & Recreation Plan. Lindley motioned to pursue the lower estimate to convert Merrill Park ball diamond into a green space. Second by Jensen. AYES: 5 (Lindley, Jensen, Gant, Moyer, Staroska) Abstained: Crawford and Eyberg. Motion carried.

B. Recreation — Allsup reported that Movie Night in the Park has been a great success in its first year with nearly 100 people in attendance for the second showing of Zootopia 2. Adult softball league is a go for the first time since 2022 and Allsup stated that with team athletic programs nationwide in a decline it was nice to see this program going again. No action necessary.

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- C. Aquatics — Eckstaine reported that admission numbers are slightly down from 2025 at the Aquatic Center contributed mostly from a cooler June. The Capes, Crowns, & Waves event at the Aquatic Center was a great success even with sub-par weather the date of the event, and staff look forward to hosting again next year.
- D. Special Event Request — Staroska motioned to approve the rental of the Central Park stage on Thursday, August 20th for the “Air Force Brass Band” concert. Second by Moyer. AYES: all. Motion carried.
- E. Special Event Request — Moyer motioned to approve the rental of the Central Park Shelter for the “All Church Picnic” event on Sunday, September 27th. Second by Jensen. AYES: all. Motion carried.
- F. Elect board chairperson and Vice chairperson. - Lindley motioned to re-elect Russ Crawford as board chairperson and Whitney Jensen as board vice chairperson. Second by Staroska. AYES: all. Motion carried.

Subject: Proposed Additions to the Hazelwood Veterans' Wall

Brian,

Per our conversation a couple of weeks ago, we are out of blank bricks on the veteran's wall. The American Legion is in the process of requesting bids for three possible options that would add additional brick wall space.

- * Option # 1 Add an additional footer, bricks and cap extension to the east end of the existing wall.
- * Option #2 Remove top cap, add an additional three rows of bricks and reinstall existing cap.
- * Option #3 Add additional red bricks to west side of west "wing" (Presently exposed concrete block)

A couple of challenges to consider:

- * Availability of bricks and cap that will closely match the existing bricks.
- * Difficulty to rework "outside" surface of west "wing" and preserve existing bricks on "inside"/east face. -- option #3
 - * Large commemorative plaque in center wall would no longer be vertically centered if option # 2 is selected. Relocating the plaque could be a line item in the bid.
 - * If the new brick and cap are significantly different than the existing material, option # 2 would make this more noticeable.
 - * Additional footer excavation would be required if option #1 is selected.

Part of the preliminary planning was to solicit suggestions, comments or concerns from the Hazelwood and Grinnell City staffs.
